In November some of our volunteers attended an introduction to First aid course. You will be pleased to know that they are now familiar with how to use a defibrillator, should the need ever arise.

Money Matters

Funding, Donations & Subscriptions

The wonderful campaign organized by Karen and the committee, aided by your letters to local councillors and MPs, helped retain

our funding for the current year. However, it is not certain whether we will continue to receive funding in future years.

The annual donation/subscription request went out to service users in October. So far we have received over £1000 from this initiative, which helps towards the costs of providing our readers and shoppers. It is never too late to make your contribution, so if you have not yet responded and feel able to help support us, please go ahead. The Local Giving match funding initiative has also been used to good effect, where we have received over £900 in matched donations. We have also been given a £3000 grant to cover training (we are not allowed to publicise the donor). Several service users and volunteers have also given generously to help support the Reader Service.

Fundraising

Paula Varey reported that Asda sent us a cheque for £50 from their "Chosen by you, given by us" scheme.

We also raised over £270 from our flag day at Asda in July. We are again taking part in the Christmas CMK Car Raffle with three slots to sell tickets in Middleton Hall. Our next newsletter will report the outcome. We are so grateful for those of you who valiantly stand holding collecting buckets or selling tickets to help with our fundraising. We are also grateful to the Walnut Tree Community shop for their valuable support and were pleased to receive a cheque for £5000. Please keep taking in your unwanted things for them to sell, it is all appreciated.

Volunteer Travel Expenses

Please send mileage claim forms into the office by the end of the month. Documents are generally sent to the treasurer during the first week of the following month. This means if you miss the end of month deadline it may take up to six weeks for your expenses to come through. Stephen, our treasurer, can now pay expenses directly into your bank account, so please include this information with your claim if you have not previously made these arrangements with him.

Accessible Arts!

We can provide volunteers to accompany Service Users to theatres and other events within Milton Keynes. However, it is essential that Karen has plenty of notice in order to make arrangements.

A Night at the Theatre?

If a person is unable to attend Milton Keynes Theatre unaccompanied, then they and their escort/carer are entitled to half price tickets. Make the staff aware of your needs when booking. You should show proof of disability in order to qualify for your discounted access-rate tickets.
